## Overview

This program is designed for undergraduate students interested in a career as a special education teacher. Students will be prepared to work with students with disabilities in P-12 settings. Students who successfully complete the degree and certification requirements and have a positive recommendation by the faculty will be recommended for teacher certification in multi-categorical special education.

## Admission to the Professional Program

All University teacher education students must apply and be admitted to Professional Program/Internship at midpoint(s) in their programs prior to final internship (i.e.student teaching). Requirements for admission vary by program, but for undergraduate students include 60 credit hours with a minimum overall GPA of 2.75 , successful completion of a state-approved basic skills examination. Students in the BA in Special education must also complete EDTE 201, EDFI 300, EDPY 401, and EDEX 523 with a grade of C or better.
