The CS-STEM Institute, funded by the National Science Foundation between July 2020 through June 2023, is a pioneering project designed to integrate culturally sustaining pedagogies within STEM education, inaugurally focusing on the Gullah Geechee community in Georgetown, SC. It employs innovative approaches like three-dimensional learning and community-based participatory research to enhance STEM learning and teacher development. The project has achieved significant outcomes in broadening STEM participation among historically underserved groups and opens avenues for future educational innovations and community engagement in STEM fields. GJMPP Alumni Dr. Regina Ciphrah and Dr. Jamelle Ellis are members of the multi-PI team with Dr. Fenice Boyd of the University of South Carolina.

Dr. Regina E. (Wragg) Ciphrah, a distinguished alumna of the African American **Professors** Program (AAPP), exemplifies scientific acumen, educational innovation, and community engagement. Her Ph.D. in Biological Sciences from the University of South Carolina



underpins her contributions to culturally sustaining STEM education and social justice.

As CEO and Principal of Verbalizing Visions, LLC, she bridges theory and practice. This organization offers education capacity building, educator coaching, and policy implementation. Her role in the Culturally Sustaining STEM Institute, an NSF-funded project in Gullah/Geechee communities, exemplifies her commitment to integrating community wisdom with scientific inquiry, creating a learning environment that respects cultural heritage and fosters curiosity. In previous roles at the SC Department of Education and the USC College of Education, she balanced educational field needs with policy compliance. Her current involvement with SC TEACHER underscores her influence in shaping state education policy implementation and practice.

As an Adjunct Professor at Voorhees University, she coleads the STEAM Education Course Series, integrating theory with practical teaching. Her tenure as Ms. Palmetto Pride Plus America 2017, promoting STEM education, and her role as Chair of the advisory board for the South Carolina Coalition for Mathematics & Science demonstrate her commitment to making transdisciplinary learning and STEM literacy accessible and engaging for all. Now a 2023-24 SC Education Policy Fellow, she strives to shape educational policies to align with educator and learner needs. Her journey, marked by academic rigor, community involvement, and policy influence, establishes her as a notable AAPP alumna.



Dr. Jamelle Ellis is the Senior Scientist Theodore Roosevelt Conservation Partnership (TRCP), a national conservation organization with a mission to guarantee all Americans quality places to hunt and fish by strengthening laws, policies, and funding affecting fish and wildlife conservation access


based on the best available science. In this role, she coordinates stakeholder groups nationally to advise on active management practices related to coastal, wetlands, and forest ecosystems as well as climatesmart solutions and wildlife conservation strategies based on contemporary science models. She earned her Ph.D. in Environmental Health Sciences from USC in 2013 where she studied exposures to methylmercury through fishing and fish consumption patterns in SC Sea Island communities. Since becoming an alumna of the Grace Jordan McFadden Professors Program (GJMPP), she has also served as the principal and coprincipal investigator on National Institutes of Health and National Science Foundation grants establishing and evaluating baseline health assessments in SC Sea Island communities in response to port expansion environmental exposures and training middle school teachers to develop culturally sustainable STEM curriculum in SC Gullah communities, respectively. Dr. Ellis is the founder and CEO of Empowerment Strategies, LLC, an environmental sustainability consulting firm with contracts that support NEPArelated mitigation and environmental management projects since 2018. She attributes a great deal of her professional foundation and success to the training, nurturing, networking, and funding provided by the GJMPP during her tenure as a doctoral student and candidate at USC. She is a native of Charleston, SC. She currently resides in Blythewood, SC with her husband and they share three amazing young adult children, two sons and a daughter.

Brian Johnson, Ph.D. President Warner Pacific University

Dr. Brian L. Johnson serves as the 8th President of Warner Pacific University (Portland, Oregon). Previously, he served as 7th President of Tuskegee University (2014-2017). He has also formerly served as a Campus Vice President, Vice President for Strategic Planning and Institutional Effectiveness & (Chief Diversity Officer), Assistant Provost of Academic Affairs, Chief of Staff, Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, Program Director, Coordinator and both Associate and Assistant Professor of English. Dr. Johnson received a Ph.D. in 17th-19th Century American literature at The University of South Carolina at Columbia (2003), a M.A. in English from The University of Wisconsin-Madison (1998) and a B.A. in English from Johnson C. Smith University (1995).

Dr. Johnson is also a sought-after speaker who shares a powerful and compelling biographical narrative of his experiences as a first-generation student growing up in inner-city Durham, North Caroline recounted in an August 31, 1995 article, the Raleigh News and Observer titled, "A Young Man Apart, A World Apart." Dr. Johnson was inducted into the Durham, North Carolina-based Salvation Army Boyd Club Hall of Fame and the Boys and Girl Club of American (formerly John Avery Boys Club) Hall of Fame and the City of Durham, North Carolina proclaimed January 20, 2015, "Dr. Brian Lamont Johnson Day."

An accomplished professor, scholar and academic administrator before the age of 40, Dr. Johnson has been selected to speak at several events. Among the more notable was his selection as Clemson University's Martin Luther King, Jr. Speaker, Auburn University's Martin Luther King, Jr. Speaker, Westmont College Provost Lecture Series, University of Toledo Black History Month Speaker, Grambling State University Founder's Day, Gordon College's Faith Seeking Understanding Lecture Series, Simpson College's George Washington Carver medal recipient lecture, the Doctoral Hooding speaker at the University of South Carolina-Columbia and commencement speaker at Mercy College where he was awarded Dr. Johnson his first honorary doctorate in 2016.

As a scholar, Dr. Johnson is the editor and author of (7) academic and scholarly books: (2) books on William Edward Burghardt Du Bois, W.E.B. Du Bois: Toward Agnosticism (2008) and Du Bois on Reform: Periodical-based Leadership for African Americans (2005); co-editor of (4) volumes on American History in the Conflicts in American History Series (2010)–Volume 3: Civil War, Volume 4: Reconstruction, Volume 7: The Long Civil Rights Movement and Volume 8: Towards the Next American Century; coauthor of (1) institutional history of his alma mater, Johnson C. Smith University, titled, The Yancy Years: the Age of Infrastructure, Technology and Restoration (2008). Among several administrative and academic fellowships, he has been named a (2012-2013) (A.C.E.) American Council on Education Fellow (Indiana University Purdue University-Indianapolis Chancellor's Office/Lilly Family School of Philanthropy/Lake Institute of Faith and Giving), a (2012-2013) (A.A.S.C.U.) 

On November 4th, 2023, nine scholars of the Grace Jordan McFadden Professors Program teamed up with the Columbia People's Program to prepare and distribute food, water, and clothing to the homeless. 










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
